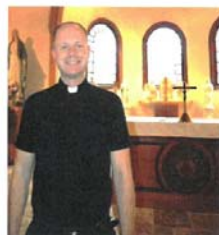

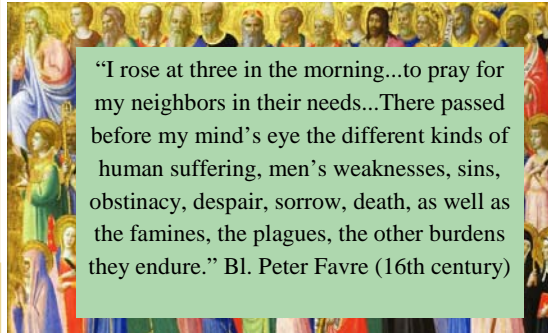

To give via text, follow these steps:

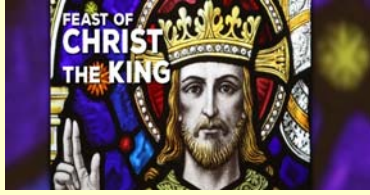
1. Text \$ amount to (251) 257-2732.

The annual Archdiocesan celebration of the Feast of Christ the King will be held on Sunday, November 25, 2018, beginning at 10:30 a.m. in Bienville Square in downtown Mobile. The Christ the King Procession will walk west on Dauphin Street to Cathedral Square while reciting the Holy Rosary. Upon conclusion all will enter the Cathedral-Basilica of the Immaculate Conception where Mass will begin at 11:00 a.m. During Mass, Archbishop Rodi will confer the annual Christ the King Medal to those selected by their pastor to be recognized for their exemplary service to the parish community. Everyone is invited to participate in this celebration and witness to our faith and heritage.

LaVeral Graf also known affectionately as “Sissy” went home to the Lord on June 8, 2018. It can be said that St Ignatius has been and always will be a forever home for LaVeral and her family. A proud alumni of St. Ignatius herself, she went on to send all four of her children to St. Ignatius and was a loyal parishioner to the end. Her family is certain that she was singing “Alleluia” from the pearly gates of heaven when her beloved grand-daughter Camille became an Impala this year. LaVeral was a proud Catholic who felt a true calling to minister others in all that she did. Her call to serve others truly had no limits and could be felt in the smallest exchanges with strangers on the street in need of money, to working with prisoners pursuing their GED’s and more recently becoming a court appointed legal guardian for elderly women in need. With great love, LaVeral established the back pack ministry at St Ignatius approximately 5 years ago. Since its inception, it has grown into the largest volunteer ministry in the parish. While her avid work as a volunteer in this ministry was impactful, she took great pride in her 30 years of service to the Mobile County Public School System, 20 of which were spent serving in the capacity as Principal. She was impassioned to serve in the public school system and advocate for children. LaVeral’s greatest pride and joy came from being wife, mother, and grandmother to her family. She is survived by her husband Emil, their 4 boys and their 10 soon to be 11 grandchildren, and the Sanders Family which includes her sister and her 6 brother and their extended families.
