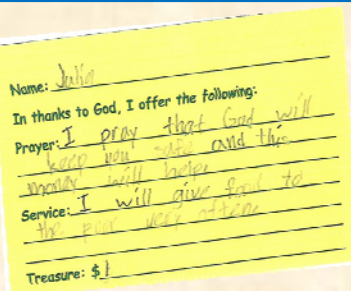
(Please Reserve your seats today! Its not necessary, but it helps us to plan.)

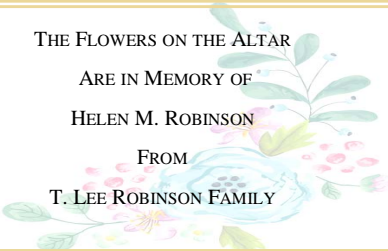

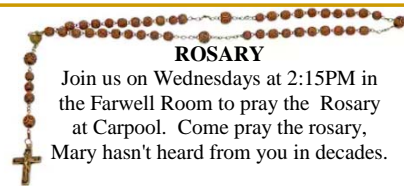
